Eczema is an inflammatory skin condition that causes itchiness, dry skin, rashes, scaly patches, blisters and skin infections. There are seven well-documented types of eczema: atopic dermatitis, contact dermatitis, dyshidrotic eczema, neurodermatitis, nummular eczema, seborrheic dermatitis and stasis dermatitis, which can have physical, mental and quality of life burdens ranging from mild to debilitating.



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OUR STORY

The National Eczema Association was established in 1988 in Portland, Oregon by individuals, nurses, doctors and others with first-hand experience of eczema. We have a dedicated board of directors, a Scientific and Medical Advisory Council made up of top researchers and clinicians in eczema, and volunteers who raise awareness in communities for our collective cause.

HOW WE MAKE AN IMPACT

NEA provides programs and resources to elevate the diverse lived experience of eczema, and help patients and caregivers understand their disease, actively engage in their care, find strength in one another - and improve their lives. Additionally, NEA advances critical eczema research and partners with key stakeholders to ensure the patient voice is represented and valued in education, care and treatment decision-making.

In addition to providing comprehensive information on eczema to patients, caregivers and healthcare providers through its website, email newsletters and quarterly magazine, NEA also offers its Seal of Acceptance product directory to help find suitable personal care and household products; an Eczema Provider Finder; and Eczema Expo, an annual patient conference and community gathering. Recently, NEA launched its first app, EczemaWise, to help patients and caregivers manage their (or their child's) eczema.
